






VANCOUVER BULK TERMINAL

Vancouver Bulk Terminal LLC (VBT) is a Joint Venture established in 2023 between Nautilus and Neltume Ports to operate a Bulk facility in the Terminal 2 of Port of Vancouver.

Terminal 2 is operated by **Metro Ports** a Nautilus International Company.

VBT was conceived to improve **operational** and **sustainability standards** in the **Port of Vancouver** and the **Columbia River** waterfront.

About Port of Vancouver, USA



Located in the City of Vancouver, Washington, USA, Port of Vancouver ("PoV") was founded in 1912. It is up the Columbia River from the Pacific Ocean in a 13 meters deep navigation channel.

The port has 5 terminals and 11 berths that handle more than 400 vessels per year, with a total cargo volume of more than 7 million tons.

PoV has connection with two interstate highways and a rail network that spans the continent, making it a major gateway to the US and Canada.

In 2023, VBT signed a 30-year long-term lease contract with Port of Vancouver (PoV) with two, 10-year renewals options to operate T2, B7. Berth 7 is utilized for all dry bulk ship berthing and loading activities at Terminal 2.






